As main prison institutions thathave been established long time ago are not adequate to accommodate present prison population, new project of relocation of urban prisons was introduced under accepted classification of supplying accommodation and improvement of infrastructure facilities, and the initial step of relocation of Bogambara Prison at Pallekele was set off this year. With that, EhelepolaWalawwa- Kandy where Kandy Remand Prison was continued, has been relocated to Dumbara, and special event of handing over of this Walawwa (Mansion) to government took place this year, therefore all inmates in Bogambara Prisonwere transferred to Dumbara at the beginning of 2014.

Further, it has been finished all basic actionsnecessary forstarting proposed Tangalle and Angunakolapelessa Prison Complex Construction Project-2014 with the aim of shifting inmates from Colombo Remand Prison and Tangalle Prison.

In accordance with the concept of HononrabaleMinister of Rehabilitation and Prisons Reforms, art fair (Kalapola) was held in front of Prison Headquarters with the participation of all prisonsisland wide aiming to showhidden and inborn talents of inmates and to make spiritual development in them by way of directing inmates to religious, cultural and art activities. Also, it was signed a MOU with the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Skill Development to make TalentCentre at PallansenaCorrectional Centre to providewith vocational training being able to get contribution of youth labor to the economy.

Action has been taken to approve required posts in the cadre under prison reformations and also to fill vacancies in certain posts. A project of easily accessing to Prison Information System which helps to get information on prisoners accurately and quickly, has been established and infrastructure facilities andhuman resource to implement this project have already been provided.

Prison administration has also been formalized with modern technology. All special dates are to be celebrated in grand scale during 2013.

I remind gratefully Honourable Minister of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms who always give me necessary strength in turning prison administration a goodgovernance to the country, Deputy Minister, Secretary to the Ministry, my staff of the Department of Prisons who give fullest corporation to me in all activities.

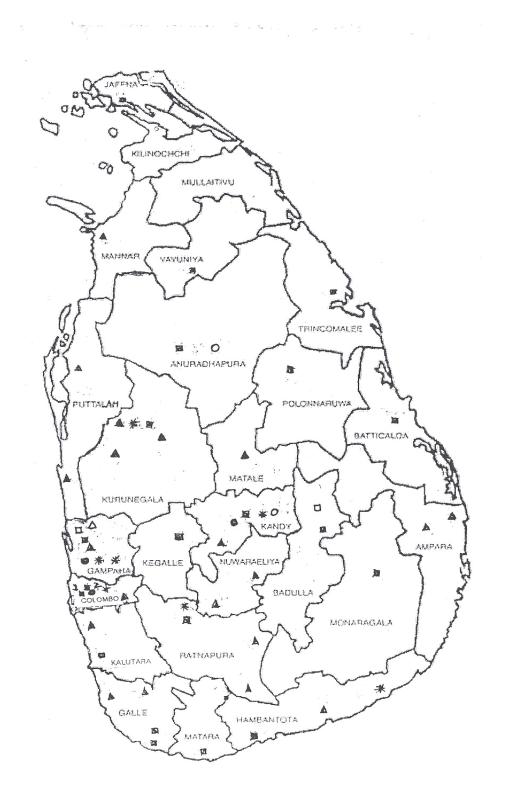
Prison Logo



Prison commenced as a result of the judicial reforms introduced by Cameron in 1832. Welikada Prison was established compatible with British Borstal System in terms of the Legal and Court Ordinance no. 18 of 1844. By the Prison Act no.16 of 1877, this service was structured and regulated under a separate department directly under control of the Commissioner of the Prisons with the effect from 16th July, 1905. With development of the society, this service turn out to be very crucial. As a result of this, Mahara Prison was built in 1875 and the Bogambara Prison which was in the form of the "Been Field' Prison in England was constructed in 1876. The prison evolved this way, has become an essential and specific institute before the complexity of present day society. Accordingly, the Prison system consists of 3 prisons, 20 remand prisons, 2 correction centers for youthful offenders, one training centre for youthful offenders, 10 work camps, 2 open prison camps, and 20 prison lockups and are under the control of Superintendents of Prisons. There are about 23,000 inmates under their custody.

Though this department which comes currently under the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Prison Reforms, cared and secured prisoners at the beginning, today it has gone beyond the limit of it and has become a social correction center of rehabilitating inmates. Here, this performance report illustrates the endeavor of rehabilitating and socializing inmates as good citizens to the society by the Department of Prisons as a social adaptation body.

Engineering Division of the Department of Prisons consists of two sections; civil Engineering and mechanical engineering.
