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## **Introduction**

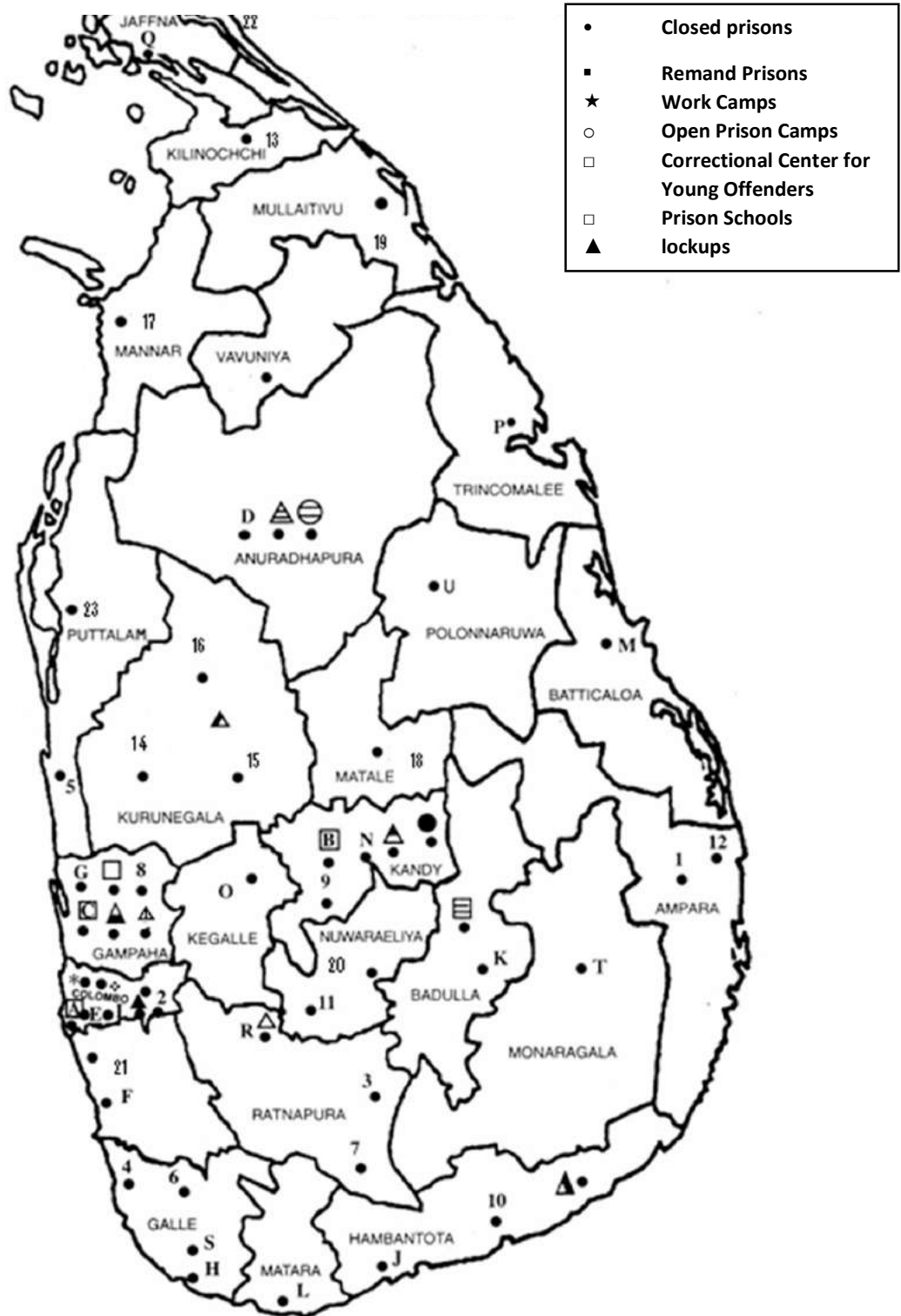
### **Moto – Custody, Care, and Correction**



Prison commenced as a result of the judicial reforms introduced by Cameron who governed Sri Lanka in British Era in 1832. Welikada Prison was established compatible with British Borstal System in terms of the Legal and Court Ordinance No.18 of 1844. By the Prison Act No.16 of 1877, this service was structured and regulated under a separate department directly under control of the Commissioner of the Prisons with the effect from 16<sup>th</sup> July, 1905. With development of the society, this service turned out to be very crucial. As a result, the Mahara Prison was built in 1875 and the Bogambara Prison which was in the form of the “Been Field Prison” in England was constructed in 1876. Today, the prison evolved this way, has become an essential and specific institute before the complexity of present day society. Accordingly, Prison system consists of 3 closed prisons, 19 remand prisons, 2 correction centers for youthful offenders, 9 work camps, 2 open prison camps, and 20 prison lockups and a prison school are under the supervision of Superintendents of Prisons. There are about 17,000 convicted and remand prisoners under their custody.

Though it was provided custody and care to inmates in the past, presently this department is administered under the Ministry of Prison Reforms, Rehabilitation, Resettlement and Hindu Religious Affairs and it has gone beyond the limit of it and become a social correction center that rehabilitates inmates. In this performance report, illustrates the endeavors of rehabilitating and socializing inmates as good citizens by the Department of Prisons as a social adaptation body in 2016.

## **Planning Division**

### **Welikada Prison Complex.**

Urban Development Authority is taking action to convey, through the Divisional Secretary-Horana, the land called “Horana-Soranawatta” in extent of 28 acres belonging to Kotagala Plantation Ltd., to the Department of Prisons to relocate below mentioned institutes in Welikada Prison Complex.

- Welikada Closed Prison
- Welikada Female Ward
- Prison Hospital

In addition, Master Layout Plan will be done by the Department of National Building appointed the Prime Minister Office and a committee appointed by the Department of Prisons will provide information needed and preliminary work of the project has been completed by now. Environmental Impact Assessment Report for the construction proposed prison in the land has already been requested from the Central Environment Authority.

It has been decided to convey a 04 acres from the B.C.C. land- Colombo to the Department of Prisons for relocating Colombo Remand Prison and Magazine Prison. Designing and planning are due to be done by the Department of National Buildings appointed by the Prime Minister's Office.

It has been recognized as a suitable land in extent of 10 out of 60 acres with Farm Oil Cultivation belonging to Horana Plantation bordered to road that runs to War-Equipment Training School in Uduwara, North -638B at Millaniya Divisional Secretariat in Kalutara District to shift shift Prison Training School. A suitable land is being tried to find for the construction of Prison Headquarters and it has been reported to the Ministry that the land is not adequate for constructions with in 04 acres in B.C.C.land.

#### **Relocation of Badulla Prison.**

As informed by the letter of the Secretary to the Ministry of Prison Reforms, Rehabilitation, Resettlement and Hindu Religious Affairs, dated September 28, 2016 and numbered MPRRH/06/04/Prison/Land/Badulla, though the land in extent of 2 acres 2 roods, 28.8 perches next to Spring Valley Road in Hindagoda-Badulla was proposed to be the best for aforesaid matter, in terms of the Cabinet Decision dated August 17, 2016 and no. අමප/16/1474/745/018, it has been taken steps to recognize a suitable land for shifting the prison to a environmental and social friendly area away from the urban area. Accordingly, it is being taken action.

### **Relocating of Galle Prison**

Under project of relocating prisons in more space area away from urban congestion, it was proposed to shift Galle Prison to the place where Boossa Prison has been established and Matara Prison to Kotawila Watta Premises in Weligama-Matara.

Accordingly, in terms of the Cabinet Decision, it has been handed over the Committee appointed by the Department of Prisons to do the Master Layout Plan and together with the State Engineering Cooperation appointed by the Prime Minister's Office to provide consultation service. Also, it has been taken action to obtain policy approval regarding the construction work from the Department of National Planning and preliminary step regarding the Master Layout Plan in is progress

### **Relocating of Kegalle Prison**

Under project of relocating prisons in more space area away from urban congestion, the land called "Ambanpitiya Land" belonging to Kegalle Plantation in Bisowela Village of Galigamuwa Divisional Secretariat has been recognized as a suitable land for relocating Kegalle Prison. A Fitness Certificate from the National Building and Research Institute has also been obtained. Accordingly, future work is due to be performed.

### **Relocation of Negombo**

Under the project of relocating prisons in more space area away from urban congestion, the land called "Imbulgaswadiya Watta" in extent of about 05 acres in Kadirana Village at Katana Divisional Secretariat has been recognized to be suitable for shifting Negombo Prison.

### **Relocation of Batticaloa Prison**

Under the project of relocating prisons in more space area away from urban congestion, the land in extent of 23 acres situated at the Thirupperunthurei Grama Niladhari Division at Mahamunai North Divisional Secretariat in Batticaloa District has been conveyed to the Department of Prisons by the letter no.LB/MN/01//95 of the Divisional Secretariat and dated February 03,1995. Accordingly, planning and construction work necessary for the proposed prison will be done by a committee appointed by the Department of Prisons together with the Urban Development Authority appointed by the Prime Minister's Office.
